





his award-winning debut novel by Iranian journalist Nasim Marashi follows the lives of three young women in Tehran over the course of two seasons as they pursue their wildly different dreams. By vividly capturing three distinct voices, Marashi's deeply wrought narrative shows how friendship, ambition, and unconditional love for each other have the power to hold these women together in all their humanity and complexity. In the process, Marashi shines a rare spotlight on female friendship in contemporary Iran and on the cost of emigration – what it means for those who leave and for those who stay behind.





NASIM MARASHI was born in Tehran, Iran in 1984. She started her career in journalism in 2007 and became a screenwriter in 2013. She won the Premier Prix in Bayhaqi Story Prize (2014) for the short story *Nakhjir* and the Premier Prix in Tehran Story Prize (2015) for the short story *Rood*. Her debut novel, *I'll Be Strong for You* (Cheshmeh Publications, 2015), was selected as the Best Novel of the Year in the 8<sup>th</sup> Jalal Al-e Ahmad Prize and is in its 40<sup>th</sup> printing. The book was translated in Italian and Kurdish and received great acclaim. Marashi is the co-writer of the feature film *Avalanche* (2015) and the documentary *20th Circuit Suspects* (2017).



his novel is set in an Igbo village where the people's worship of their gods is absolute. Their adherence to tradition has allowed them to evade the influences of colonialism and globalisation. But the village is reckoning with changes, including a war between gods signalled by a girl who can fly. Re-imagining the nature of tradition and cultural heritage and establishing a folklore of the uncolonised, this is a novel about wrestling with gods, confronting one's demons and understanding one's true purpose.

OKEZIE NWOKA was born and raised in Washington, DC. They are a graduate of Brown University, and attended the Iowa Writers' Workshop as a Dean Graduate Research Fellow. They are presently teaching and living in their hometown.





bsurd, lyrical, and heartfelt, Melissa Lozada-Oliva's *Dreaming of You* is a genre-bending novel in verse that examines questions of death, love, celebrity and queer identity.

A young Latinx poet grappling with loneliness and heartache decides one day to bring *Tejano* pop star Selena Quintanilla back to life. The séance kicks off an uncanny trip narrated by a Greek chorus of gossiping spirits as she journeys through a dead celebrity prom, encounters her shadow self, and performs karaoke in hell. In visceral poems embodying millennial angst, paragraph-long conversations overheard at her local coffee shop, and unhinged Twitter rants, Lozada-Oliva reveals an eerie, sometimes gruesome, yet moving love story.

MELISSA LOZADA-OLIVA is the child of Guatemalan and Colombian immigrants. She co-hosts the podcast Say More and holds an MFA from NYU in poetry. Her writing has been featured in Remezcla, PAPER, The Guardian, The BreakBeat Poets Vol.4, Wirecutter, Vulture, Bustle, Glamour, The Huffington Post, Muzzle Magazine, The Poetry Project, Audible, and BBC Mundo. She is from Massachusetts and lives in New York City.

Starting with her viral poem Crossing Half of China to Fuck You, Yu Xiuhua's raw collection chronicles her life as a disabled, divorced, single mother in rural China. Thematically organised, her essays and poems are in conversation with each other around subjects that include love, nostalgia, mortality, the natural world and writing itself.





YU XIUHUA was born with cerebral palsy in Hengdian village, Hubei Province, in Central China. Unable to attend college, travel, or work the land with her parents, Yu remained home where she could help with housework. Eventually she was forced into an arranged marriage that became abusive. She divorced her husband and moved back in with her parents, taking her son with her. In 2014, her poem *Crossing Half of China to Fuck You* became an online sensation, launching her career as a celebrity poet and writer. Yu received the Peasant Literature Award in 2016 and the Hubei Literary Prize in 2018.
